Classroom Allocation

\$8,100

\$300 allocation to each of the 27 teachers that have a classroom, including Phys Ed and French

To cover such items as **in-class supplies** for hands-on projects, classroom libraries, materials

Items purchased to be consumed this year, or **stay in the classroom** (not teacher-owned)

This is the **same** per teacher amount as last year

Discretionary Student Support

\$5,000

To ensure all students have **equal access** to school events and activities by providing financial support to those who can't afford them otherwise

Has gone towards winter gloves/hats, programming, field trips, and lunch programs

STEM Materials

\$20,000

Materials and supplies to support the **Science**, **Technology**, **Engineering**, and **Math** curriculum activities

Includes: tablets and chromebooks for 40 new students, Ozobots, x-rays, lighted mirror tables

Note: we're actually a STEAM school; the "A" is covered under a separate proposal

Arts Programming

\$10,000

This is the "A" in our **STEAM** programming

Music enrichment program for all grades that culminates into our Holiday Concert

Preparation is incorporated as **classroom learning** for our students October to December - it is curriculum based

These funds will be allocated to the **December 2020** concert

Music Instruments

\$6,000

Replace the very old and irreparable pieces we've had for a long time

The goal is every student has a working, decent sounding instrument

May include: 2 alto saxophones (\$900 each), clarinet (\$400), flute (\$400), trumpet (\$600), and materials and resources (drum sticks, a few drums, and mouthpieces)

Reading Materials

\$4,000

Forest of Reading student book club

read a predetermined collection of books throughout the year that results in province-wide student choice award

high student engagement throughout school

after, books become part of classroom literature circle collections

Replacement of existing reading material that is damaged or out-of-date in order to maintain a current, culturally relevant collection

Indigenous Curriculum

\$3,000

To enable our students to gain a deeper **understanding and appreciation** of the history, culture and contributions of Indigenous people and their communities

At the **request** of the students from their initial learning in 2017

Includes reading material, guest speakers, art appreciation, and storytelling

Guidance and Clubs

\$3,000

Supplies related to school wide clubs available to various grades

To help run events and create their program material

Includes: Girls Group, Eco Club, Creative Writing, Student Engagement, Garden Club, Gay Straight Alliance, and Me to We

Orange crosswalk flags to be placed at **key intersections** within proximity to the school

\$100 per intersection; we'll start with **5** (10 to 15 high usage in our boundary)

To aid in child visibility and **safety** when crossing the street

Need a parent volunteer to help cut PVC pipe and do installation

A **day of activities** hosted for Grade 6 students from Leaside community schools, integrating them in preparation for being together in Grade 7

Funds will cover activities and food

Benefits grade 6 students from Bessborough, Rolph and Bennington

Allocation of \$23.50 per student as in past years

To assist in providing a **memorable community event** to celebrate the time these families spent at Bessborough

Benefits Grade 8 students and families

Last year, we decided H&S funds would include a charity allocation

The **Men with Axes** proudly supports this endeavour at their annual events

Giving the **Empower Reading** to Pelmo Park Public School, run by Sick Kids Hospital, helps struggling readers reach grade level and beyond

We have seen the positive in our school and are excited to share the gift of literacy with other children in this way

This allocation would be done from funds raised in 2019/ 2020 school year
